







Altimetric profile




Min elevation 387 m Max elevation 501 m

- 1. Go towards the church and at the cemetery turn right onto the D7 and follow it to Creuse.
- 2. Continue alongside the river, cross it and at the fork, take the direction of La Vignolle.
- 3. Go through the village and continue to Serras.
- 4. When you reach the hamlet, take the path on the left and continue through the woods.
- 5. Take the ford across the Creuse on the left to join the D 18; then follow the road for a mile.
- 6. At the fork, take the road on the left to Maneyraux.
- 7. Go through the hamlet and turn right; at the crossroads, take the road on the left; go straight ahead to Satagnat.
- 8. Go through the village always keeping to the right.
- 9. Take the road on the left and, at the crossroads, turn left and follow the road for 1 km.
- 10. At the crossroads, turn left and then right to reach the hamlet of Ceyvat.
- 11. Take the D7 on the right and then turn left.
- 12. Turn left and follow the road for about 1 km until you reach the D7.
- 13. Turn right to get back to the starting point.
